FINANCIAL READINESS

- Budgeting for Expenses: Prepare for ongoing costs (food, grooming, veterinary care, pet insurance).
- **Emergency Fund:** Set up an emergency fund for unexpected medical expenses.

SUPPORT SYSTEM

- Veterinary Care: Identify a local veterinarian for regular check-ups and emergencies.
- **Support Network:** Have a network of friends, family, or pet-sitters who can help when needed.
- **Local Resources:** Know the location of nearby pet supply stores, dog parks, and training centers.

FINAL STEPS

Shelter Research: Research local shelters or rescue organizations.
Adoption Application: Complete any necessary paperwork for adoption.
Meet and Greet: Plan visits to meet potential dogs.
